The Alamo has big plans for enhanced visitor experiences. The latest of these advancements includes the brand-new Ralston Family Collections Center. Now open to the public, this new state-of-the-art facility houses portions of the Phil Collins Collection in addition to other incredible artifacts and collections in its 10,000-square-foot exhibit space. Stay tuned for continued renovations and improvements happening through 2026!

San Antonio welcomes a brand-new facility behind **Mission Concepción**—Padre Margil Pilgrimage Center, which will provide visitors with information and support for El Camino de San Antonio Missions: a 30-km pilgrimage, which will count as part of the "Inglis Route" of Spain's *El Camino de Santiago de Compostela. Peregrinos*, or pilgrims, will have the opportunity to have their Camino passports stamped and obtain their San Antonio Compostela for credit in Spain.

MUSIC SCENE

What once served as a central connection train station to multiple states at St. Paul Square is now **The Espee** (formerly known as Sunset Station), an outdoor performance venue that welcomes live entertainment in beautiful downtown San Antonio. Enjoy live music and discover your new favorite artists under the Texas stars!

Also new: a nearly 130-year-old building that once housed brewery draft horses transforms into a new live music venue at **Pearl** Stable Hall in the fall. Stable Hall is the next chapter in San Antonio's music history. Catch national touring artists as well as regional talent from Texas, Mexico and the Americana Music Triangle—encompassing the area between Nashville, Memphis and New Orleans.





FAMILY FUN

Let the San Antonio Zoo show you why it is rated the #1 Zoo in Texas with new experiences. If you enjoy the majesty of butterflies, head over to the John and Greli Less Butterfly House, where monarchs and other species are eager to welcome you year-round. For younger visitors, Discovery PLAYce, designed to provide nature fluency and support safe play for children up to five years of age, recently opened at Kronkosky's Tiny Tots Nature Spot. Coming late 2023, expect a brand-new front entry, which includes expanded zoo entry with immersive, interactive experiences and themes that perfectly capture the true essence of San Antonio and the Zoo.

welcome Catapult Falls, the first launched flume coaster in the world complete with world's steepest drop in a flume ride. Feel the thrill as you are launched at speeds of 30 feet per second as you make your way high above the park before free falling into the steepest drop!

Another thrilling experience for the courageous is coming soon to **Six Flags Fiesta Texas**. The all-new KID FLASH[™] Cosmic Coaster will be a first-of-its-kind single-rail family racing roller coaster, which allows guests to compete and race to the finish line illuminated by an LED lighting panel. Expect an expansion of Hurricane Harbor that includes a collection of eleven individual waterslides and raft rides.

Hemisfair recently unveiled a new toddler play area made just for smaller visitors in Yanaguana Garden. Hemisfair is also excited to open Phase I of Civic Park in the fall. San Antonio's take on Central Park, Phase I of Civic Park will include five acres of public parkland, shaded areas perfect for San Antonio's brilliant, sunny weather, a fivepooled water feature and a great lawn area, accommodating of San Antonio's larger events.

And if you're on the hunt for incredible Peruvian options, Southtown recently welcomed Leche de Tigre to the scene. This cebicheria and pisco bar can't wait for you to experience

Pearl may be a foodie's dream, but the area surrounding Pearl is growing with new flavors as well. Here you can find **Restaurant Claudine**, the perfect place to eat when you're craving a French twist on Southern comfort classics. Also in this area is Go Fish Market. A high-end seafood café also offering up fresh seafood for purchase. Two pop-ups now open at Food Hall at Bottling Department are Pasta Factor, offering fresh takes on popular pasta dishes, and Three Six General, offering Central Texas-style smokehouse classics, including fried chicken, hot pastrami, wings, fries and more. Finally, check out Carrigui, named after the South Texas green jay who's flight path encompasses much of South Texas-just like Carriqui's menu.

> • The Farmer's Market area of Historic Market Square has a massive new mural titled "The Spirit Within."





Created by collaborative artists Ashleigh Garza and Hailey Marmolejo, the bright, colorful mural pays homage to the history of women and their work at Market Square. It features women donning luchador masks, constellations and *Alebrijes* (brightly colored mythical creatures represented through Mexican folk-art sculptures that can be found throughout Market Square).

• Located in the **River Walk** Public Art Garden, the Labor Plaza area honors the history and legacy of labor in San Antonio, along with labor's ties to social justice and civil rights causes. The plaza is designed in a spiral formation—a form commonly found in nature, and features a poem and tiles by Octavio Quintanilla (San Antonio Poet Laureate 2018-2020). Etched in the ground is an excerpt from labor anthem "Solidarity Forever" written by Ralph Chaplin in 1915.

Against the backdrop of an old limestone quarry, scream on a record-setting racing roller coaster or giant swing ride. And look for the new first-of-its-kind, innovative e-sports gaming center, ESIX Gaming powered by Coca-Cola[™], complete with stateof-the-art computer equipment coming soon! At the Hurricane Harbor, take your pick from lagoons, rafts, slides and a drenched tree house. Seasonal musical and theatrical acts keep everyone's feet tapping. Shop for souvenirs, photo ops and Looney Tunes gifts before chowing down on burgers, turkey legs, regional cuisine and Dippin' Dots[™] ice cream.

Nowhere else fosters fun for everyone regardless of abilities like Morgan's Wonderland. The world's first and only ultraaccessible™ theme park recently was joined by new sports and camp complexes where

Dating back to 1891, Fiesta San Antonio's Battle of Flowers® Parade is one of the only parades in the country produced entirely by women.

Animal fans will have more fun than a barrel of monkeys at world-class **San Antonio Zoo**. The Zoo's interactive experiences paired with their incredible conservation efforts make it easy to see why it is so beloved by locals and tourists alike.

At the safari-style **Natural Bridge Wildlife Ranch**, cruise through 450 acres of authentic Texas ranchland and interact with more than 500 animals from all around the world.

SEA LIFE Aquarium brings the ocean indoors with sharks, clownfish, seahorses, sea turtles and stingrays floating and swimming by in pools and tanks. Take a walk through the Ocean Tunnel!

LEGOLAND® Discovery Center San Antonio offers endless hands-on learning and builds on its reputation for fun with shows, rides and Lego-play opportunities. Be sure to catch a show at the LEGO® Cinema!

Head to the top of the **Tower of the Americas** for expansive, panoramic citywide views and then lower your altitude by traveling through the underground, massive caves of **Natural Bridge Caverns**.




TAKE A RIDE ON THE WILD SIDE

San Antonio amusement parks know how to turn up the thrill-ride meter as high as it goes. Get your adrenaline pumping with record-setting rollercoasters, super-high swings and fantastic flying machines.

At SeaWorld San Antonio, visitors will soon be able to splash over the falls and into river rapids on the new Catapult Falls flume coaster, featuring the only vertical lift in North America and the steepest drop in the world. The ride joins SeaWorld's high-thrill favorites like Texas Stingray, the tallest, fastest and longest wooden coaster in Texas, and Tidal Surge, the world's tallest and fastest screaming swing that lets you experience the weightless sensation of "negative G."

Aquatica San Antonio's Riptide Race pits two rafts against one another in side-by-side flumes, beginning at the top of a 51-foot tower. Execute tight loops and turns, exciting

drops and high speeds as you slide 565 feet to the finish line. The park's Tonga Twister water slide zooms you through 400 feet of twist and turns before ending in a splash out.

At **Six Flags Fiesta Texas**, visitors will soon be able to take on the KID FLASH[™] Cosmic Coaster, Texas' only racing roller coaster, made with comfortable seating for both adults and children. Six Flags' many other exciting rides include Dr. Diabolical's Cliffhanger coaster, a world-record-setting, themed roller coaster unveiled last year to celebrate the park's 30th anniversary.

Morgan's Wonderland theme park and Morgan's Inspiration Island splash park feature 25 ultra-accessible™ attractions on its 25 acres called "an oasis of inclusion." Take a scenic spin on the Wonderland Express train and let the kids behind the wheel on the Off Road Adventure's winding trail. Over at Ultra-Accessible[™] Morgan's Wonderland Camp, summer camp experiences happen year-round for people with and without special needs. Check out the horses, archery range, challenge course and zipline, all supported with a round-the-clock health center and twenty on-site cabins. Morgan's Wonderland Sports supports adaptive and Paralympic-style sports programs for kids and adults. For an immersive and creative experience, take the family to **Hopscotch**, an interactive art gallery. Rooms feature works from artists around the world, each with a different sensory experience.

Nature, science and culture meet at **The Witte Museum**, dedicated to telling the Texas story as demonstrated by Earth and its people. See Texas ecosystems, flora and fauna in expansive dioramas and galleries showing Texas from the time of the dinosaurs and prehistoric hunter-gatherers to trail drivers, settlers of South Texas and the famed King Ranch. Rotating exhibits and permanent galleries answer questions you may not even know you had! Check out Antarctic Dinosaurs: A Forest Frozen in Time for a deeper look at dinosaurs and how they once thrived in Antarctica.

UTSA Institute of Texan Cultures is a Smithsonian-affiliate museum and cultural hub that tells the stories of the many people and cultures that have shaped Texas. Handson, interactive exhibits include a "Faces and Places of Texas" dome show. Don't miss the return of their Asian Festival this May and the iconic Texas Folklife Festival in 2024, just some of the ways that the institute shows guests an enriching and engaging time.

Open parkland, a toddler play area and restaurant options are part of an extensive renovation of **Hemisfair**, the site of the 1968 World's Fair. Yanaguana Garden features a splash pad, eateries including **Dough Pizzeria Napoletana** and Commonwealth Coffeehouse, and a 4.1-acre play environment designed for all ages and abilities. Renovated, late 19th-century homes will soon house Künstler Tap and Brat-Haus and Bombay Bicycle Club. **Re:Rooted 210 Urban Winery**'s Hemisfair location makes it a great place to unwind—even with family in tow with its proximity to Yanaguana Garden and wine to go option! A new toddler play area hugs the shore of the historic Acequia Madre. And Hemisfair's five-acre Civic Park will encompass a shared promenade, a five-pool water feature and the Great Lawn for both running about and large events.

Natural Bridge Caverns recently debuted its Hidden Wonders Tour experience showcasing a never before toured area of the caverns. A State Historic Site and National Natural Landmark, Natural Bridge Caverns' other ways to see its cavernous beauty include a Twisted Trail Adventure Course, a curving zipline experience that has guests clambering over four levels and more than 50 elements. Twisted Trails Tykes gives little ones a taste of the spelunking adventure.

Get up close and personal when you spy on hundreds of free-ranging animals representing 45 species at **Natural Bridge** **Wildlife Ranch**. From the comfort and safety of your car, you'll see horned oryx, addax, emus and giraffes, just for starters. It's not unusual to spot baby animals! Be sure and stop at the rhino habitat, scheduled animal feedings and the exotic animal petting zoo.

Something's always doing at **The DoSeum**, the hands-on, engaging San Antonio children's museum for all ages, from babies to teens. Kids stretch their scientific and imaginary wings in the DoSeum's exhibits, programs, camps, classes and field trips. Permanent exhibits like Spy Academy and Force Course let children experience for themselves science, art and culture while rotating exhibits inspire curiosity and get hands-on with lessons and demonstrations.

Lay a few bricks at LEGOLAND® Discovery Center San Antonio and enjoy Miniland San

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Antonio—with miniature replicas of local attractions constructed nearly entirely from LEGO® bricks. And hang on for rides and experiences such as Great LEGO® Race VR and Merlin's Apprentice Ride.

It might be far from the ocean, but SEA LIFE Aquarium San Antonio lets moray eels, sharks and otherworldly jellyfish float right above and by you as you make your way past tanks and through the city's longest ocean tunnel. Interactive zones bring you close to some of the 5,000 fresh-water and marine friends you'll greet from dry land as they move about their watery homes.

Steps from the Alamo, there is fun for the whole family at **Ripley's Believe It or Not!** Here you'll find three attractions: Louis Tussaud's Waxworks features more than 200 life-like wax figures in themed settings; Ripley's Believe It or Not! covers three floors filled with 500 unusual and fascinating exhibits; and Ripley's Moving Theater 4D is a motion simulator specialeffects theater. With fun for all ages, don't miss these exciting attractions.

Be sure to look up when you visit the **San Antonio Zoo** jaguar habitat, housed in the zoo's Neotropica realm. The only one of its kind in the U.S., Pantera Walk is an overhead connected catwalk where the big cats move between Amazonia and riverbed habitats, giving guests a thrill. Over at the rhino habitat, enjoy the savannah-like setting that allows rhinos, zebras, waterbucks, sitatungas and even giraffes to move freely. The conservationaloriented zoo often has babies making their debut, like the critically endangered white-cheeked gibbon born in early 2023.

Bar-B-Cutie Smokehouse

If you love meat, this is a place for the whole family. Kids ages 8 and under will love the Kids Menu, which includes a sandwich or chicken tenders plus a choice from the impressive sides menu. Adults will have trouble narrowing down their orders from a big selection of smoked meat plates and sandwiches, soups and salads and, of course, desserts.

Boiler House Texas Grill & Wine Garden

Located in Pearl and with a Kid's Menu full of little's favorites, both adults and children alike will enjoy artfully prepared, gourmet Texas Hill Country fare at Boiler House.

Bubba Gump Shrimp Factory

Southern-style comfort food inspired by the classic film "Forrest Gump" keeps the whole family satisfied. It's no surprise that you can have shrimp prepared every which way, from sautéed to fried to loaded with coconut. Check out the baby back ribs, burgers, salads and a menu just for kids.

Chicken N Pickle

Fuel your victory at this pickleball venue with a casual menu of chicken, ribs, burgers and an assortment of child-approved selections. While it's hard to imagine anyone wanting to play anything else, six indoor and four outdoor pickleball courts are complemented by other games, including Jenga, Battleship, cornhole, bocce ball and ping pong.

The Guenther House

San Antonio history comes alive at this 19th century Art Nouveau mansion, which houses a casual breakfast and lunch restaurant and bakery. The adjoining museum and store make for a multifaceted visit.

Hard Rock Cafe

Situated along the River Walk, you'll find three floors of patios and balconies to encourage relaxing while your hungry group dines to rock-n-roll hits and enjoys views of the San Antonio River.

Joe's Crab Shack

Take in the River Walk view while enjoying coastal dishes, including fried shrimp platters, steam pots, signature fish entrées and creative cocktails like the Shark Bite. It's one of the few places where you'll find crab on the kid's menu along with a crab-shaped dessert ready for the little ones to "paint" with chocolate, butterscotch and strawberry sauce.



La Gloría at Pearl

An eclectic outdoor atmosphere perfect for for food and fun, iconic chef Johnny Hernandez draws on travels throughout Mexico to elevate diverse dishes at this restaurant.

Lone Star Café

Since 1981, hungry diners have sat here on the shady balcony tucking into homemade queso and chips as they while away the afternoon. The family-friendly menu has plenty of popular options, including burgers, sandwiches, steaks, chops, chicken and barbecue. End your meal with homemade peach or apple cobbler served in a sizzling skillet.

Mí Tierra Café Y Panadería

For more than eighty years, Mí Tierra has proudly served authentic Tex-Mex fare. Festive piñatas, streamers and a giant mural are a party for the eyes, as is the dizzying array of the bakery's traditional Mexican candies and pastries, like yoyo de piña. Be sure to time your breakfast, lunch or dinner visit with the live Mariachis who perform.

The Good Kind

The Good Kind offers a garden oasis for families to enjoy a quick meal for lunch or dinner, or brunch on the weekends. The restaurant offers a healthy children's menu. Complete with a kid's garden with local vegetables & herbs, there's plenty of space for exploring.

Rainforest Café

Right off the River Walk, you can dine in a jungle amidst waterfalls, hanging vines, a rainforest animal show and the sound of rainstorms and wild creatures. Menu selections include beef lava nachos, Caribbean coconut fried shrimp, Amazon fajitas and the famous volcano dessert.

Rosario's Comidamex & Bar

Bright, fresh and family-friendly, Rosario's has won multiple "best of" restaurant awards. The made-from-scratch menu features locally sourced ingredients in traditional Mexican dishes and original house specialties. THE GREAT "ARTDOORS"

It isn't evey day you can pair a great trip outdoors with some out of this world art, but San Antonio has ample opportunities for outdoor art—and many of them are free!

Not all of San Antonio's vibrant art is in museums. Located near the intersection of Market and Alamo Streets, the **River Walk Public Art Garden** is an outdoor museum showcasing public art installations for all to enjoy. The Garden includes an immersive public art experience, including free-standing sculptures, wall-mounted art installations and informational displays. Some artworks featured also have larger installations, which can be found all over San Antonio. Look for the new Labor Plaza section, which pays tribute to the Labor Movement in San Antonio. Here are a few art works to look for:

Bloom in San Antonic

You can find even more "Bloom" sculptures by Leticia Huerta in San Antonio parks. These radiant, oversized metal flower sculptures are part of a collection created from elements that, up close, resemble larger-than-life bicycle parts.

Stargazer (Citlali) by Mexican artist Pedro Reyes Built at over 16 feet tall upon a 5-foot base and crafted with more than 80 pieces of Mexican volcanic stone and a marble star, "Stargazer (Citlali)" ascends over visitors as they make their way through the garden along the meandering banks of the River Walk.

The adventures in San Antonio are as big as Texas! Explore the outdoors with these favorite scenic tours and exciting attractions and parks.

San Antonio Missions National Historical Park

History infuses every inch of Texas' only UNESCO World Heritage Site, with approximately 10 miles of trails connecting four of the area's five Spanish frontier missions, daily National Park ranger-led programs, and beautiful vistas along the San Antonio River.

Government Canyon

The 12,000 acres north of San Antonio guards much of the city's water, and offers visitors' the perfect stomping grounds... literally! The 110-million-year-old footprints of dinosaurs can be found within the 40 miles of trails throughout the state urban refuge, alongside all manner of wildlife and geological wonders.

San Pedro Springs Park

Only one public park in America is older than this beautiful retreat, although it still maintains the title of San Antonio's oldest. Even before its park designation, however visitors have travelled to take in the area's rejuvenating springs and creeks for over 12,000 years.

Brackenridge Park

It's hard not to find something for everyone to enjoy in the historic park along a stretch of the San Antonio River. With Lambert Beach, a full Japanese tea garden, Sunken Garden Theater, and the San Antonio Zoo, Brackenridge offers visitors' days' worth of repeat visits to take in everything to offer.

Hardberger Park

The Phil Hardberger Conservancy Park might be the only preservation to boast about the highway that runs through it... but with good reason! Completed in 2021, the Robert L.B. Tobin Land Bridge is a 150-foot-wide expanse connecting both sides of the park, ingeniously allowing both wildlife and human visitors a safe, tranquil passageway high above the Wurzbach Parkway bustle. Other park draws include its butterfly learning center and geology trail, alongside regular workshops and information sessions.

Travis Park

The land that is now Travis Park features a rich history dating back all the way to 1819, and at one time was part of upper farmland for the Mission San Antonio de Valero—aka the Alamo. It now offers a relaxing oasis in central San Antonio regularly host to fitness, music, and dance programming throughout the year.

Woodlawn Lake Park

Woodlawn Lake Park is all about open spaces and open communities—with a full gymnasium, Wi-Fi enabled community center, regular public library activities, and a health kiosk, visitors can exercise their brains and bodies.

McAllister Park

McAllister Park is a perfect fitness excursion for both humans and their four-legged friends. Miles of paved and natural trails offer visitors scenic views, while the nearly two-and-a-half acre dog park is open seven days a week to keep your shaggy pals happy and healthy.

Eisenhower Park

For outdoor enthusiasts searching for the perfect scenic views, Eisenhower Park is a must visit. Hilltop lookouts provide stunning vistas of the nature surrounding San Antonio, alongside walking trails and two pavilions available to rent for your next event.

Hemisfair

One of San Antonio's newest draws, Hemisfair is built atop the site of the historic 1968 World's Fair, with multiple urban parks near completion. Yanaguana Garden is already open to children and adults alike, and features sandy play areas, splash pads, and activities including cornhole. Yanaguana's beautiful sister sites, Civic Park and Tower Park, are expected to open this year.

Real History, True Heroes.

Experience San Antonio's vibrant history through five 18th century Spanish colonial missions.

Open daily from sunrise to sunset and only closed on major U.S. holidays, visitors to our city are welcome to explore history, architecture and culture at **San Antonio Missions National Historical Park**, a member of the National Park Service. The largest collection of Spanish colonial missions in the United States, San Antonio's combined total of five 18th century Spanish colonial missions—Mission San Antonio de Valero (**The Alamo**), Mission Concepción, Mission San José, Mission San Juan and Mission Espada—have been designated as a **UNESCO World Heritage Site** since 2015—the first and only UNESCO World Heritage site in Texas!





San Antonio Missions National Historical Park

The history of San Antonio's early Spanish settlers who later became our city's founders can be found throughout our historic missions. You may be surprised to find that though these iconic locations are brimming with history, they are still active, thriving communities today.

Mission Concepción remains true to its original design. Did you know this is the oldest unrestored church in the country? On the church's exterior, some of the original geometric designs are still visible. Inside, the original frescoes remain vibrant, showcasing the stunning artwork typical of the time.

Visit Mission San José and look for its striking Rose Window and façade, a lavish example of Spanish colonial ornamentation. Fundamental to the city's rich history, Mission San José once provided sanctuary and a social and cultural community for more than 300 Indians. You can also find a central visitor's center here, as well as the departure point for free park ranger-guided tours.

During the mid-1700s, Mission San Juan was known for its fertile farmlands and abundant crops, a prime example of a selfsustaining community. The mission also sustained fellow communities, providing goods to the surrounding regions as far south as Mexico. Mission San Juan's chapel and bell tower are still in use today.

Mission Espada is San Antonio's southernmost mission. Take in the compound's blacksmith shop, colonial-style irrigation system and still-functioning kiln and spinning wheels for a glimpse into the Native American and Spanish settlers' agrarian ways of life. Sections of the historic Espada Aqueduct, the oldest Spanish aqueduct in the U.S., will soon undergo preservation and restoration work to repair leaks, remove sediment and preserve the aqueduct's heritage and character.

Take in the city's beautiful sunshine by traveling between the missions using Mission Reach, which extends south of downtown to connect the River Walk to four of the five UNESCO status San Antonio Missions. Mission Reach winds through an eight-mile riparian woodland ecosystem, featuring smooth walking and biking paths accented by public art for a memorable outdoor experience.



"REMEMBER THE ALAMO!"

No trip to San Antonio is complete until you have remembered the Alamo—at the Alamo! Stop by the Alamo and discover for yourself why it is the most visited attraction in the Lone Star State!

Travel back in time by exploring the Alamo, first established as Mission San Antonio de Valero in 1718. Now known as one of the most pivotal battle sites in the country, the Alamo became a military outpost in 1793, cementing its iconic role as a central locale on Texas' road to independence.

VISITING

The Alamo is more than the site of the legendary Texas battle of 1836, but also stands as one of the ultimate symbols of the spirit of patriotic sacrifice. The Alamo and surrounding historic site are undergoing some exciting changes with the goal of preserving the historic grounds and enhancing the experience for visitors. The multi-year, multi-phase restoration includes preservation of the Alamo Church and Long Barrack, and the creation of a new world-class museum and visitor center with completion expected by 2026.


Don't miss the newly opened Ralston Family

Collections Center, which features priceless artifacts and interactive exhibits. Here you'll find prized pieces from British rock star Phil Collin's personal collection, as well as items from the Donald and Louise Yena Spanish Colonial Collection and the Alamo Collection. Built on the Alamo Gardens behind the Alamo Church, this two-story, 24,000-squarefoot center is the first addition to the Alamo grounds since the 1950s.

Open daily (closed Christmas Day). Entrance to the Alamo historic church and grounds is free but visitors must obtain a timed-entry ticket available on-site. Check out visitsanantonio.com for more information.

Fiesta San Antonio

Did you know the city's iconic festival has ties to the Alamo? **Fiesta San Antonio** first started as a means to honor the memory of the soldiers lost in the battles fought at the Alamo and San Jacinto, Fiesta San Antonio has remained the city's signature event since the late nineteenth century. Since 1891, it has evolved into an 11-day extravaganza with more than 100 events that celebrate the history, arts and cuisine essential to its heritage.



NEW! EL CAMINO DE SAN ANTONIO MISSIONS

Located behind Mission Concepción is Padre Margil Pilgrimage Center. Here is where the visitors can find information and support for El Camino de San Antonio, a 30km pilgrimage, which will count as part of Spain's "El Camino de Santiago" or 'The Route of Santiago Compostela'. Pilgrims will now have the opportunity to have their Camino passports stamped right here in San Antonio.

TEXAS' CONFLUENCE OF CULTURES

Our past and present are made up of remarkable figures from around the world and the multitude of influences they brought with them to San Antonio: Spanish and German settlers, cowboys and cowgirls, Mexican poets and musicians, Asian immigrants and influential figures, Black artists and historical leaders—the list is long and all-encompassing.

The Alamo City is rich in dynamic cultural sites and events: colorful murals telling personal stories and anecdotes, river parades and festivals celebrating our diverse communities, historic cultural sites like Historic Market Square and La Villita featuring galleries and goods created by the very people who call San Antonio home. Speaking of Historic Market Square, did you know it's the largest Mexican market in the U.S? Take a stroll along the threeblock outdoor plaza lined with shops and restaurants in downtown San Antonio and find your next favorite unique find. The Casa Navarro State Historic Site consists of a house and office, both dating

Gallery Scene

Artpace is San Antonio's premier nonprofit contemporary art venue, which hosts local, national and international artists in its residency program. Find out why they call it a "laboratory of dreams."

The Contemporary at Blue Star was founded by artists and grew from a grassroots art exhibition in 1986, the Contemporary is the first and longestrunning nonprofit space for contemporary art in San Antonio.

Centro de Artes Gallery is dedicated to telling the story of the Latino experience in the U.S. With a focus on South Texas through local and regional art, history and culture, the gallery exhibits showcase Latino Artists and Latino-themed works. Look for the gallery in the heart of Downtown at **Historic Market Square**.

Located in the Plaza de Armas building, **Culture Commons** consists of a storefront gallery on the first and second floors, as well as a 1,500-squarefoot exhibit hall that features visual art exhibits, performances, guest speakers and workshops.

Hopscotch San Antonio is an immersive art experience housed in a permanent 20,000-sq.ft. gallery that features 15 distinctive immersive and interactive installations from over 40 local, national and international artists.

Contemporary arts center Ruby City is one of San Antonio's newest arts spaces. Inside the red-hued Ruby City building you will find more than 900 works from the Linda Pace Foundation Collection, including paintings, sculptures, installations and video works. The dream of the late artist, collector and philanthropist Linda Pace, the museum presents curated shows and programming through the year and is free and open to the public.

Housed in La Villita Historic Arts Village, **Yolix Luna Fine Art** features the self-trained artist's colorful work, which draws inspiration from both her travels and Mexican heritage.

Southtown The Arts District comes alive during First Fridays and Second Saturdays for nights of art, good food and music. The family-friendly events invite visitors to the neighborhood. Stop by The Friendly Spot Ice Haus for food and drink specials and take in free musical showcases at the First Friday Market and Music at Brick at Blue Star, located in the Blue Star Arts Complex. back to the 1850s, and a kitchen from the 1830s—once belonging to José Antonio Navarro, a signer of the Texas Declaration of Independence and a writer of the Texas State Constitution, who was a champion of civil rights for Hispanics. Steps from the River Walk discover the **Spanish Governor's Palace**. This National Historic Landmark permits visitors a glimpse into life in Texas under Spanish rule.

Historic neighborhoods throughout the city reflect rich cultures and heritages. **King William** showcases the city's German heritage and was designated a Cultural Arts District by the Texas Commission on the Arts in 2011. **Monte Vista** is one of the largest historic districts in the country and our city's **Eastside** is the perfect place to learn about San Antonio's **Black heritage**. Learn more about San Antonio's **vibrant neighborhoods**.

BREATHTAKING MUSEUMS

San Antonio is home to stunning art galleries and incredible museums that are perfect for both art-lovers and history buffs. Discover new art pieces and expand your knowledge in San Antonio's museums and galleries.

Become wrapped up in the spirit of the American West and learn about American cowboys at the **Briscoe Western Art Museum**. Located just off the River Walk downtown, you'll find three floors of artifacts, paintings, sculptures, fascinating rotating and permanent exhibitions and more.

Known best for its Medieval and







Renaissance art, as well as its European and American collections, the **McNay Art Museum** enchants all who enjoy the visual arts. Founded in 1954, the McNay Art Museum features a pristine assortment of more than 200,000 works of modern art that stem from its namesake Marion Koogler McNay's 700-piece collection.

The Witte Museum is where nature, science, and culture blend and come alive. Massive exhibits of dinosaurs, People of the Pecos and Texas Wild and other rotating exhibits—like the Antarctic Dinosaurs exhibit running through September 10, 2023—make for educational family fun. The Witte offers exciting spaces like the Mays Family Center, Naylor Family Dinosaur Gallery, the H-E-B Body Adventure and The South Texas Heritage Center, among other historic and cultural attractions on its ten-acre, gardenladen campus.

Visit, listen, explore and learn all things Texas at the UTSA Institute of Texan Cultures. Located in **Hemisfair** near the **Tower of the Americas**, visitors get to see how diverse cultures from countries spanning the globe have influenced the Texan identity. Families experience exhibits, programs and special events designed to entertain, inspire and educate here. Don't miss the Asian Festival in May!

More than 5,000 years of art, people and culture await at the **San Antonio Museum of Art**. Housed in the historic Lone Star Brewery downtown, visitors can explore 30,000 pieces bridging 5,000 years of history and culture. The museum holds the largest collection of Asian art in the Southern U.S.,







as well as one of the most comprehensive collections of Latin American Art. Insider tip: Stop by **Tre Trattoria**, located on site a bite to eat before or after your visit.

Experience digitized audiovisual exhibits rich in culture, storytelling and empowerment at the San Antonio African American **Community Archives and Museum** (SAAACAM). Dedicated to preserving and telling the stories of San Antonio's African American history, SAAACAM maintains a growing digital collection of related artifacts in the form of a community-based archive. Educate yourself on stories of the city's African American decedents that date back hundreds of years to Spanish colonialism and the Texas Republic. Insider tip: SAAACAM hosts African American history river boat tours throughout the year, offering 100 minutes of Black History as you drift along on the beautiful San Antonio River.



The oldest arts organization in San Antonio can be found in the King William District: San Antonio Art League Museum (SAAL&M). Always free to the public, SAAL&M can be found in a stunning and intimate house-turned-museum and gallery and houses more than 400 works in all media focused on Texas artists, including revolving contemporary exhibits.

Contemporary artists can showcase their work in the 11,000-square-foot exhibition space, four on-site galleries and multiple offsite locations that make up Blue Star Arts Complex. Developed from a grassroots event in 1986, Blue Star is the perfect place to start exploring when you visit the **Southtown Arts District**, where five neighborhoods make up one creative community.

The **San Antonio Fire Museum** is a hidden gem for children and history buffs alike. Housed in the original Central Fire

Headquarters next door to the Alamo, the museum displays antique fire trucks and equipment, as well as memorabilia. Retired firefighters on hand share personal stories and teach fire safety, and children can dress up and climb on some equipment.

The historic Fort Sam Houston is home to the **U.S. Army Medical Department Museum**, an establishment that aims to educate visitors on the history of the Army Medical Department from 1775 to present day. The evolution of battlefield medicine, medical equipment, and patient treatment are all subjects highlighted in the sevenacre campus' various galleries and exhibits.

PERFORMING ARTS

Real Talent. True Performances.

Talent overflows in San Antonio. Extraordinary theaters and music venues make for incredible nights of theater, dance, live music and spoken word performances. Our flourishing performing arts scene is championed by our phenomenal theaters, which include Tobin Center for the Performing Arts, the Majestic and Empire Theatres and more. A full calendar of theater, dance, opera, live comedy and celebrated international, national and local musical acts take center stage throughout the year.

At the stunning Spanish Mediterraneanstyle **Majestic Theatre**, even locals line up early for shows. Built in 1929, this National Historic Landmark is home to the popular Broadway in San Antonio series. The gold-

trimmed **Charline McCombs Empire Theatre**, beautifully restored to its original 1913 splendor, will have you reliving the golden age of Hollywood. Reflecting the city's Mexican heritage, the **Aztec Theatre** hosts a variety of films, concerts and other events in a Mesoamerican architectural work of art.

Catch your favorite musical or play at the **Public Theater of San Antonio**, the longest-running theater in Texas, featuring local talent and diverse programming that entertains, engages, and enlightens locals and tourists alike. Over at the **Carver Community Cultural Center**, you'll find incredible performances celebrating the diverse cultures of our world, nation, and community, with emphasis on its African and African American heritage. Each season offers eclectic and multi-ethnic representations from various disciplines such as dance, music and theater.

Meanwhile, the **SOLI Chamber Ensemble** has been giving voice to 20thand 21st-century contemporary chamber music since 1994, mesmerizing audiences for nearly three decades with their engaging performances, ensuring the future of new music through educational initiatives, and continually renewing their commitment to the music of living composers through performances and commissions.

For high-caliber artistic performances, be sure to catch a free performance by **Musical Bridges Around the World**, Public events include a seasonal concert series, continuous art gallery exhibitions, an annual music festival, and a quadrennial international piano competition.

Overseeing the San Antonio River, the Tobin Center for the Performing Arts is overflowing with talent—resident companies include Ballet San Antonio, AtticRep Theater Company, OPERA San Antonio, Youth Orchestras of San Antonio, the Classical Music Institute, and The Children's Chorus. The arts center features a state-of-theart performance hall, studio theater and an outdoor performance space where world-class dance, musical, comedy and theatrical performances are offered.

Located adjacent to **Hemisfair** and Yanaguana Garden, the **Magik Theatre** has been bringing stories to life for children and families with professional, accessible, literaturebased theatre since 1994.

On the historic Westside, the **Guadalupe Cultural Arts Center** is the city's home for Chicano, Latino and Native American performing arts and entertainment. Inside, the Galería Guadalupe showcases art exhibitions emphasizing local and regional artists, and the GCAC's professional resident program, the Guadalupe Dance Company, specializes in Mexican flamenco and folklorico dance styles. Other great places to see special events and concerts include the **AT&T Center**, the 64,000-seat **Alamodome** and the 2,319-seat Lila Cockrell Theatre, tucked inside the **Henry B. González Convention Center**, where traditional performing arts as well as multi-media events are staged.

Do not leave without trying the crispy jerk fried chicken wings, braised oxtails and Jamaican patties.

Re:Rooted Urban Winery is a tasting room located in **Hemisfair** in downtown San Antonio. A kegged wine system provides Re:Rooted wines on tap, enjoyed by the glass or growler. Insider tip: They offer wine to go!

Authentic German dishes like potato pancakes, Reuben sandwiches, schnitzel and their famous split pea soup (Tip: add a bratwurst) continue to make **Schilo's** **Delicatessen**, the city's oldest restaurant, a true classic. Meanwhile, the breezy and modern **NONNA Osteria** pairs its Eurocentric wine list with succulent northern Italian dishes like Pappardelle Al Cinghiale (pasta with roasted bell pepper and wild boar) and Ravioli All'Aragosta (ravioli with lobster, pancetta and cherry tomatoes).

Even before restauranteur and TV personality Guy Fieri shined the spotlight on **Dough Pizzeria Napoletana**, San Antonians knew that these authentic pies were something special. Made with true Neapolitan techniques, these pizzas impress with a thin crust and farm-fresh toppings, cooked to perfection in a woodburning oven in only 90 seconds. Look for a **second location** north of the city.

For a vibrant dining experience, check out **Mi Tierra**, a landmark Mexican café and bakery with traditional dishes, handmade margaritas and mariachis on site, visitors can expect authentic food with a friendly atmosphere.

Enjoy a tasty Tex-Mex breakfast or lunch at **Poblanos on Houston Street Mexican Restaurant**, offering authentic San Antonio flavor, or enjoy brunch all day at **Box St. All Day** tucked into the park at Hemisfair.

San Antonio's theater district shines with stellar restaurants. Steaks and seafood take the spotlight at **Silo Prime**. The roof-top terrace and a cocktail menu of old-school classics with modern twists also deserve a standing ovation. At Texas de Brazil, a churrascaria, or Brazilian steakhouse, performance is part of the meal. Watch acrobatic "wine angels" serve wine from suspended wires while gauchos serve juicy beef from skewers.

Meet friends for the perfect "pre-show" hors d'oeuvre and bottle of wine at **The**

Palm steakhouse. Enjoy prime steaks, daily fresh seafood and a casual atmosphere at lunch or dinner. Season your meal with live jazz at Bohanan's Prime Steaks & Seafood. Savor Texas-raised Akaushi beef and seafood classics like the mesquite-grilled Gulf red snapper in old world elegance with a lively cocktail bar.

Morton's The Steakhouse is the spot for juicy New York Strips, tender filet mignons and seafood-filled Ocean Platters, starring a cold-water lobster tail. The St. Anthony Hotel is where you will find Rebelle, where fresh shrimp, oysters and Alaskan King Crab come in towers and all seven of the "deadly sins" have their own cocktail.

River Walk

A feast for the eyes and the palate, the **River Walk** welcomes pedestrians with towering cypress trees, charming stone bridges arching over the gentle river and the delightful sounds of strolling mariachi bands.

Feel free to sleep in when you have brunch plans at **River's Edge Café + Patio Bar**. Enjoy brunch, lunch and dinner favorites with a South Texas Twist, like dulce de leche pancakes and Baja shrimp tacos, right at the banks of the River Walk. At Hotel Havana, the elegant steel and glass conservatory of Ocho provides a stunning backdrop for creative Pan-Latin cuisine and your new profile pic. Enjoy a freshly muddled mojito and antojitos ("little cravings" or appetizers) over the river or descend the stairs to the candlelit Havana Bar.

Chefs hold a special place in the hearts of San Antonians. Chef Bruce Auden has been setting the standard for fine dining at **Biga on the Banks** for over 20 years. This James Beard Award nominee blends European, TexMex, American and Asian flavors to create very new American cuisine. The three-course prix fixe is perfect for the couple who wants to share inventive cuisine and a view. At **Range**, downtown in the Embassy Suites, celebrity chef Jason Dady showcases a Tuscan steakhouse with blends of family-favorite Italian creations. After a long day of seeing the sights, enjoy a glass of wine at the long, marbled bar.

Churrascarias, or Brazilian barbecues, provide diners with outstanding cuisine and entertainment. At **Fogo de Chão**, gaucho chefs carve tender, choice cuts of meat right off the skewer and onto your plate. Find it just steps above the River Walk, adjacent to the **San Antonio Marriott Rivercenter on the River Walk**. Steak lovers and Southwest foodies unite at **Boudro's Texas Bistro**. Embrace regional flavors like blackened prime rib with Boudreaux butter or house-smoked jumbo gulf shrimp with Gulf crab enchiladas.

Romance is in the air when you are catching the breeze over the river at **Little Rhein Prost Haus**. With commanding views and authentic German cuisine, every day is Oktoberfest here.

It is impossible to squeeze every River Walk restaurant into a vacation, but that does not mean you should not try! Stop by these breezy patios during happy hour for fresh bites and flavorful drinks, while the kids enjoy their own kid-approved menu and view of the river boats.

Iron Cactus Mexican Grill & Margarita Bar serves over 100 premium tequilas and a contemporary twist on traditional Mexicaninspired cuisine. Locals and visitors alike gather on the spacious patio of **Paesanos Riverwalk** for authentic Italian cuisine al fresco. Italian food lovers will want to try the Shrimp Paesano or a selection of classic and creative pizzas. The tri-level, ultra-modern **Ácenar** is not your average Tex-Mex joint. Among the favorites of the Nuevo Tex-Mex menu are short-rib tacos, pork roasted in banana leaves and spicy shrimp with roasted cream corn pico. The **Original Mexican Restaurant** on the River Walk is sure to satisfy your craving for authentic Mexican food, drinks and fun!

Looking for that perfect blend of beer, food, and fun? **Yard House**'s eclectic Americanstyle menu is matched only by its collection of craft beer taps along the bar. In the mood for seafood? Popular **Bubba Gump Shrimp Co.**, **Joe's Crab Shack** and **Landry's Seafood House** are just steps away. Enjoy burgers, steak, seafood, sandwiches, Mexican



Just steps away you'll find **Hard Rock Cafe**, **Rainforest Cafe**, and **Fiume Pizzeria**—all offering plenty of menu variety and views.

Continue your culinary tour north of downtown all the way to **Pearl**, thanks to the Museum Reach extension of the **River Walk**. Chef Jason Dady's foodie- and family-friendly **Tre Trattoria** brings the flavors of Italy to the patio of the **San Antonio Museum of Art** overlooking a quiet section of the river. Still undecided? Hop on a **GO RIO** River Cruise and enjoy the view while you decide.

Pearl

Antonio's shining star of culinary and cultural delights is the historic **Pearl** Brewery Complex. This mixed-used space of stunning late-19th century architecture, energy-conscious structures and lively green spaces hosts some of the city's most innovative restaurants. Whether you are sharing a table for two inside the steampunk fairyland of the brewery itself or with hundreds of friends on the sprawling green lawn of Pearl Park, you will know you are in the epicenter of cool.

Named after the old Pearl Brewery's

bottling department, the upscale Bottling Department Food Hall offers a variety of dining options. From short rib burgers to rotisserie chicken, you and your whole crew can find something to enjoy. Caribbean street food meets modern flair at Mi Roti where celebrated San Antonio chef Nicola Blaque allows diners to build their own bowls or wraps with savory filling such as jerk chicken, pork belly and coconut rice. Peruvian-Asian fusion restaurant Botika has the answer: spring rolls of glass noodles, red cabbage, mango, avocado and yuzu ponzu, ceviche served with wonton chips and a bar stocked with sake, pisco and cachaça. From pop-up to Pearl, Best Quality Daughter chefs Jennifer Hwa Dobbertin (she has been nominated in the "Emerging Chef" category of the 2023 James Beard Awards) and Quealy Watson prepare creative Asian-American cuisine such as phat khaprao pork fried rice and salt and pepper shrimp inside the historic Mueller House. Check out tasty veggie options like Kung Pao cauliflower and miso ginger noodles, a vegan dish. For the culinary purists out there, the funky, riverside Mexican cantina La Gloría serves small street food plates and killer margaritas on an expansive patio and green lawn overlooking the Pearl Turning Basin.

New to Pearl are Italy-inspired sister

restaurants Allora and Arrosta. Stylish Allora offers menu items inspired by the seafood of the Amalfi Coast, serving dinner and Sunday brunch; Arrosta's all-day menu is inspired by the open-air markets of Rome and features the taste of Italian street food with uniquely Texan flavor twists. Expanding the options at Pearl is modern Mediterranean grill house Ladino, which serves a menu influenced by a mix of Castellano, French, Italian, Greek, Turkish and Hebrew dishes and centered around the charcoal grill. Named for a South Texas bird, Carrigui is a new massive 11,000-square-foot restaurant nestled in lush greenery. It aims to be a neighborhood oasis offering Southern hospitality and a menu highlighted with barbacoa, brisket, seafood, steak and cocktails. Eclectic music selections often feature Texas artists.

Housed in one of Pearl's three original structures, **Boiler House Texas Grill & Wine Garden** welcomes guests to dine on gourmet Texas Hill Country fare beside the three enormous boilers that once powered the historic brewery. Outdoor patios and balconies provide views over the wine garden. The atmosphere and menu are authentic at the popular **Brasserie Mon Chou Chou**, perfect for an afternoon

Grillin' in San Antonio

BBQ is Bigger in Texas and Better-er in San Antonio. These eateries make sure the Alamo City leaves quite the impression on BBQ lovers.

2M Smokehouse This Texas Monthly top 50 joint smokes up spicy barked brisket, tender ribs and signature sausage in its Southeast side location. Also sample the brisket tacos, the inspired side dishes and pasteries. The first Sunday of the month is reserved for barbacoa.

Bar-B-Cutie offers traditional barbecue menu items, delicious customer favorites like the Orlie, and even meals for your fourlegged friend.

County Line BBQ With a location on the River Walk, as well as its original (since 1975) spot, their famous meaty ribs, brisket and spicy sausage can be enjoyed in two locales.

Curry Boys BBQ Green and yellow curries and house-made chili oil accompany the smoked meats at this exciting San Antonio joint.

Davila's BBQ Open since 1959, this family-run joint—located in nearby Seguin—is known for its trademark sausage.

Pinkerton's Barbecue This newcomer to the San Antonio scene recently received top accolades from Texas Monthly's BBQ Editor for their "candy paint" pork ribs, snappy jalapeño-cheese sausage and tasty brisket.

South BBQ & Kitchen

Just past Mission Concepción, this tiny but mighty joint serves up meats, sides, pickles and sauce, all made in-house. Don't miss the chopped brisket or pulled pork tacos on housemade tortillas.

Smoke Texas

The best view and 'cue! This 12,000-sq.-ft. outdoor bar offers BBQ favorites and open-air views of the Alamo City. They have four locations: Smoke Texas Downtown, Smoke Texas River Walk, Smoke Texas Redland RD on the North Side of town. Smoke Texas Park North(Loop 410) is the newest location.

Two Bros BBQ Market Jason and Jake Dady, the namesake "bros," opened this location back in '09. The classic meat market style-joint continues to serve up BBQ favorites like brisket, ribs and pulled pork. An outdoor play area keeps the kiddos entertained.

The Barbecue Station Brisket, ribs and chicken shine at this oldschool Texas barbecue.

respite, like a bowl of gratinée lyonnaise (onion soup) and a glass of vin blanc or a rich meal of duck confit and a freshly shaken cocktail. As you walk into **Cured**, the brewery's former administration building, a large charcuterie case clues you into what to expect on the menu: meat-centric selections featuring housecured charcuterie plates, chicken fried chicken livers and veal osso buco. Chef Steve McHugh has been honored with five James Beard Foundation nominations. four for Best Chef: Southwest and one for Best Chef: Texas. Pack a meal to go with gourmet, picnic-ready dishes from Larder like a warm sandwich of Bratwurst with beer mustard, onions and gherkins on a pretzel roll, and remember to pick up some classic and colorful French macarons,

croissants and coffee from **Bakery Lorraine**, where pastry chef Anne Ng was named an "Outstanding Chef or Baker" semifinalist in the 2023 James Beard Awards. For a unique dining experience that highlights the talents of **Culinary Institute of America** students under the supervision of the college's worldclass faculty, be sure to stop by **Savor**.

Experience a modern take on cross-cultural cuisine on the ground floor of the historic Pearl brewhouse. At Chef Jeff Balfour's Southerleigh Fine Food & Brewery, southern cuisine meets his Galveston upbringing: oysters, crab, grilled redfish and Gulf shrimp pair well with Southerleigh drafts.

Just east of the Pearl District is **Restaurant Claudine**, offering gracious dining in a converted house. A top pick on Texas Monthly's "2023 Best New Restaurants" list, chef Cassie Ramsey's menu includes mouth-watering confit of duck leg, red trout with pea succotash, boneless short ribs, pumpkin puree and glazed carrots sprinkled with chopped pecans, sweet cornbread and an exquisite très français millefeuille for dessert. Check out the fresh catch at nearby **Go Fish Market**, which offers fresh fish to take out as well as dine-in dishes including oysters, caviar, and fish and chips.





Southtown

Whether you want to kick back under sprawling pecan trees with a breakfast taco and a spicy michelada, grab a fresh fruit smoothie and explore galleries and shops featuring local artists, or finish your meal with a spin on the dancefloor with a live Latin band, **Southtown** is the place to be. This hip culinary hub hums just a short walk from **Downtown**.

Honoring its spirit of origin, an early 20th-century firehouse (1924), Southern Italian restaurant Battalion showcases brick archways and a fire pole alongside hot dishes like ricotta and sage ravioli and parmesanherb crusted lamb chops. At Guenther House, enjoy plate-sized cinnamon rolls, fluffy biscuits and gooey apple strudels in the beautifully restored 1859 home of the Pioneer Mills founder, or dine under the stars or in an elegantly redesigned gas station at Bliss. Featuring an impressive wine list and appetizer selection—be sure to try the Japanese Hamachi sashimi tostadas-Bliss will surely bring you to culinary ecstasy. Or tuck into a platter of fresh-caught oysters at Little Em's Oyster Bar, a popular new restaurant also featuring other ocean-fresh menu items served indoors or on the cozy

patio. If you like a little caviar on your deviled eggs, book a table at **Up Scale**, Little Em's glamorous sister restaurant. On the menu: seafood, steaks and more with a full cocktail bar, all served in a stunning mid-century modern atmosphere.

Here, as the river flows alongside the Mission Reach trail, find flavorful eateries such as **Burgerteca**, Chef Johnny Hernandez's laid-back burger joint that's a Mexican twist to the all-American classic. A house favorite is the Al Pastor: a guajillo and ancho chile-seasoned patty topped with grilled pineapple, manchego cheese and cilantro. Be sure to check out Hernandez's original





Southtown establishment, **The Fruteria**. Serving fresh fruit cups, smoothies, and tostadas by day, this vibrant, colorful cantina transforms into a swanky hotspot serving Mexican tapas and fruit-infused cocktails by sundown. He's also gone and opened **Casa Hernán Cantina** here. Check out the tree trunk sprouting from the bar while you enjoy bites and sips amid the colorful décor.

The Good Kind prides itself on healthy lunch & dinner items, including snacks, sandwiches, tacos & more. They also offer a special brunch menu with a DJ on the weekends. If your culinary tour puts you in need of a digestive reset, head to the cozy outdoor patio of **Pharm Table**, where food is medicine. Pharm Table's mission is to share plant-forward meals and promote an overall better quality of life. An Apothecary Kitchen featuring locally sourced, globally inspired with a spice library, botanical cocktails, and natural wines, this one is open for lunch and dinner.

Much like the eclectic architecture of Southtown's **King William Neighborhood**, this dining district's cuisine showcases a variety of cultural influences. **Hot Joy** fires up small plates of spicy Asian food and fishbowls of tropical rum cocktails. At Maverick Texas Brasserie, French charm and Texas ingredients go hand-in-hand. Chefs cook seafood, steaks and poultry over the coals of a wood burning stove. Reserve a space on the outside patio and enjoy inventive menu items and an extensive wine list or specialty cocktails worth splurging to try.

Rosario's Comidamex & Bar welcomes guests to its new location with neon pink lights, a lively bar scene and some of the tastiest drinks in town. Consistently honored by critics as the best in San Antonio,



Rosario's offers a contemporary twist on traditional south-of-the-border dishes like fish tacos, ceviche and specialty margaritas. Check out the rooftop terrace and bar with fantastic city views.

Near Downtown

Many of the Alamo City's favorite dining destinations live along the charming commercial corridors that each give a distinct flavor to **Alamo Heights**, **Monte Vista**, **Olmos Park** and the **Broadway Cultural Corridor**.

In Alamo Heights, seek out sister establishments **Cappy's Restaurant** and Cappyccino's. For more than 20 years, these eateries have shared both a patio and an appreciation for outstanding cuisine in a laidback setting. With tasty burgers, pizza, soups and salads, Cappyccino's bistro buzzes during the lunch hour, while the jumbo lump crab cakes, beef tenderloin and cocktails impress at Cappy's for brunch and dinner.

Find traditional bakery and café items at nearby **La Panadería**, such as delicious pan dulce or the concha, croncha (a hybrid concha and croissant creation), or the tres leches croissant, but do not leave the city without trying the bestselling tequila-almond croissants. At upscale French brasserie Bistr09, a French-leaning wine list compliments classic menu items such as duck a l'orange and braised shortribs. Authentic Italian dishes, like traditional pork osso buco and veal marsala, are always popular with the locals at **Paesanos Lincoln Heights**, but no celebratory meal would be complete without their signature dish: Shrimp Paesano. In the mood for some Southeast Asian seafood? Pinch Boil House offers a fun and welcoming environment to gather and share food.

The **Broadway Cultural Corridor** is home some of the city's most beautiful museums and parks. With the addition of Chef Jason Dady's **Jardín** to the **San Antonio Botanical Garden**, nature lovers can go gourmet at the garden. Enjoy Mediterraneaninspired brunch, lunch or dinner in the historic Sullivan Carriage House or al fresco at Gertie's Garden. Since 1973, Bombay Bicycle Club has been the neighborhood hangout for Trinity University students and locals looking for a cold beer and Texas-style pub grub. Enjoy a bowl of their famous spicy chili at the colorful bar or try a blackened salmon salad out on the plant-filled patio. In **Monte Vista**, interior Mexican and classic Tex-Mex fare are best enjoyed al fresco, on the beautiful outdoor patio of La Fonda on Main. Colorful tiles and towering shade trees make this, the city's oldest Mexican restaurant, a destination happy hour spot for locals. In neighboring **Olmos Park**, chefs at the 12-seat Mixtli create ten-course regional Mexican tasting menus using ancient cooking techniques.

Best known for its nightlife and bar scene, the St. Mary's Strip area also provides opportunities to fuel up before you get down. In a hurry? Food trucks like Ka-tii Thai Street Food, Tacos el Regio and Righteous Pie pizza offer bold flavors on the fly. Check out NOLA Brunch & Beignets, serving up brunch favorites with a Creole twist, like Cajun Boudin Chilaquiles, five days a week. Have no fear. They serve beignets all day! Holding court on the strip is Little Death, where natural and European-focused wines pair with tapas-style accompaniments. On the St. Mary's Strip, there's something for everyone in your party. At Burger Boy Diner, tuck into one of their popular burgers, or corn dogs or grilled cheese with a side of crinklecut fries and a Dreamsicle Shake. Or try tacos and cocktails on a contemporary space with patio seating and weekday happy hours at Midnight Swim.

For a taste of authentic Mexican, visit Maria Bonita Mexican Restaurant and





Cantina in the Oak Hill neighborhood, where breakfast, lunch and dinner options always include homemade tortillas and fresh salsas. Drive-thru or sit down, the family-friendly restaurant features a kids menu, as well as mariachis and live music on certain nights.

North

North San Antonio's restaurant scene continues to flourish with the help of dynamic new eateries. Chef-driven and always bustling, Full Belly Café + Bar features mouth-watering breakfast, lunch and dinner items as well as a tempting cocktail menu. At Southerleigh Haute South, guests pair southernstyle food-like fried and rotisserie chicken, deviled eggs and shrimp po boyswith local Southerleigh craft brews. Wrap vourself in the warm hospitality and scenic views that surround **Paesanos 1604**. For a fresh approach to Mexican, try the cantarito and ceviches, savory empanadas and tasty tipples at Costa Pacifica. If you have an appetite for activity, head to Chicken N Pickle-not just for crispy chicken and fried pickles (though they're also on the menu)but for delicious, casual dining at the city's first pickleball complex. With a kid-approved child's menu, this is the place to score food and fun for the whole family.

Awarded the #1 spot on Eater's "Essential SA Restaurants of 2022" list, **Clementine** impresses with seasonal dishes of global flavors, created by chefs and husband-andwife duo John and Elise Russ. (John was named a semifinalist in "Best Chef: Texas" category for the 2023 James Beard Award.) After an energizing cycling class, you can refuel at The Alley on Bitters. For an an authentic experience through the fusion of classic Chinese cuisine with contemporary influences, head to **DASHI Sichuan Kitchen + Bar**. Tip: Try the Spicy Cumin Lamb Lollipops.

Sample locally sourced craft beer at independently owned Weathered Souls Brewing Co., which recently expanded to include a second taproom in Charlotte, NC. Founder Mike Holt and head brewer Marcus Baskerville's Black is Beautiful beer, and their commitment to support social justice through their brand, have gained national attention. Pair your brew with fried chicken available on-site. Smoked brisket and pulled pork will pull you back for a second helping at South BBQ & Kitchen located near the historic **Mission Concepción** on the city's south side. Up north, destination-worthy barbecue and a list of national awards draw meat lovers to the family-friendly Two Bros. **BBQ Market**.

Step out of Texas and into China at **Sichuan House** where you'll enjoy a unique perspective on traditional Chinese food in America that is surrounded by great

Hash Vegan Eats Specializing in vegan comfort food, seasonal non-alcoholic mocktails (try the zero-proof spicy jalapeño margarita) and organic, local tea, Hash (which stands for "heal and spread healing") invites guests to discover delicious, healthy and sustainable cuisine.

Jugo Juicery Get hooked on good health with coldpressed juices, superfood bowls, smoothies and detox tea.

Pharm Table Commit to clean eating! While the menu changes with the seasons, this gem's ingredients remain locally sourced and globally inspired.

Sweet Yams Offering organic, gluten-free, veganfriendly dishes, baked goods and juices, this Eastside café has amassed a following, affectionately known as the Yamily.

Vegan Avenue on Main Plant-based and glutenfree never tasted so good. Nestled in the Monte Vista neighborhood, this new San Antonio eatery serves a delicious meatless menu daily for breakfast, lunch and dinner. Dishes such as Birria-style quesadillas made with jackfruit and mushrooms and the fried "chicken" sandwich made with the poultry substitute Chick'n satisfy every palate. conversations and great individuals. Tip: The Garlicky Cold Noodles are a must-try!

If your group prefers a variety of proteins in a more formal atmosphere, J-Prime Steakhouse serves up antibiotic-free meats, including prime beef, as well as free-range chicken and wild-caught fresh seafood. And the flavor combinations (and portions) are endless at Chama Gaúcha Brazilian Steakhouse, offering churrascaria, with grilled beef, pork, lamb and chicken, and an expansive salad bar with over 30 different items. **Brasão Brazilian Steakhouse** is where traditional tastes & modern ambiance blend to deliver the true flavors of Brazil.

Eastside

Just east of downtown, the culinary/ restaurant scene is booming. Known for its Southeast Asian curry and Texas barbecue fusion bowls that are served out of a small pink shack on St. Mary's Street, Curry Boys BBQ is gaining notoriety. Chefs Andrew Ho, Andrew Samia and Sean Wen combined were nominated in the "Best Chef: Texas" category of the 2023 James Beard Award.

The unconventional Cullum's Attaboy, just around the corner from the St. Mary's Strip, is a *Texas Monthly* Top 10 of where to eat in Texas in 2023. Diners can tuck into chef Chris Cullum's flounder meunière, bavette steak with a rich demi-glace-style sauce or a serving of caviar or escargot and truffled egg. Or try the hamburger that started it all.

Treat yourself to hearty burgers and soul food at eastside establishments Tony G's Soul Food, Mrs. Kitchen and Soul Food, and Tucker's Kozy Korner. Relax in the sunshine at outdoor eateries like **Smoke Texas**, Cherrity Bar and Dakota East Side Ice House.

Raise a glass in elevated cocktail bars Pastiche and Lilly's Greenville or from your table at Toro Kitchen + Bar, an intimate Spanish restaurant featuring live music and tapas. There's something for everyone at the vibrant Hackberry Market, featuring Black Laboratory Brewing, Cake Thieves and The Magpie (Korean-inspired cuisine).





For those who love a live performance, whether it be, comedy, ballet or nationally touring concerts, you must check out downtown San Antonio. See an unforgettable show at the Majestic and Empire Theatres, the Aztec Theatre, the Carver Community Cultural Center or the Tobin Center for the Performing Arts. For those who want to witness the excitement of live music, check out venues like Paper Tiger, The Amp Room, The Mix and Hi-Tones on the St. Mary's Strip. For a real flavor of San Antonio make sure you visit The Squeezebox where you will find live music and dancing featuring Tejano, conjunto and cumbia music in addition to DJ sets. Enjoy your music under the stars at **The Espee**, the city's newly re-opened outdoor music venue. To eat well while you party down, check out The Rustic where regional fare, local beer and cocktails and live music under the stars ensure a memorable night.

San Antonio knows a thing or two about cocktails. It's so celebrated as a cocktail destination that in January it hosts the Third Coast Cocktail Summit. There you'll find seminars, parties, spirit-focused dinners, and more. Some seminars are meant for the pros who tend bar, while others are for the home barkeep. There's something for everyone.

If it's country music you're after, John T. Floore's Country Store in Helotes draws all the biggest names in country music. A timeless venue, music legends like Willie Nelson, Elvis, and Bob Dylan have all graced the stage here. In Selma, you can find the biggest acts from Texas and beyond at the **Blue Bonnet Palace**. Expand your horizons beyond country music at Sam's Burger Joint where you can find more local and touring acts while enjoying a fantastic burger.

The **Alamodome** and **AT&T Center** are more than just sporting venues, though they do a great job of this too—they also set the stage for live performances. If you are all about the comedians, make sure to check out the country's best comics at Laugh Out Loud Comedy Club. If you think you might have a funny bone, get involved in the comedy at ComedySportz. More than an old-fashioned improv show, this has quick-witted comedians competing for laughs in teams. This BYOB venue allows kids in the early shows, but it becomes adult-only as the night goes on.

CUT A RUG

Some of the best nightlife scenes are connected to San Antonio's premiere hotels. The swanky **Sternewirth**, offering signature cocktails, beer, wine and culinary temptations is located within Hotel Emma. Looking for an intimate candlelit setting? Try the Havana Bar at Hotel Havana. Live it up at **Bar Rojo** at the Grand Hyatt where you will find delicious bar bites and craft cocktails. Be sure to visit their rooftop bar open in the warmer months. For another enticing rooftop spot, check out The Moon's Daughters on the 20th floor of the upscale **Thompson Hotel**. located inside the AC Hotel by Marriott San Antonio Riverwalk. Check out 1Watson's historic location and enjoy their rooftop bar serving Southwestern cuisine and craft cocktails 15 stories above downtown.

Durty Nelly's Irish Pub, celebrates Irish culture and is faithfully modelled after a 1620 tavern in Limerick, Clare County. The Esquire Tavern is one of most beloved watering holes in the city, serving cocktails, beer and history along the River Walk and boasts the longest wooden bar top in Texas. At rooftop bar **Paramour**, choose from some 20 specialty hand-crafted cocktails while soaking in the views of the San Antonio skyline. Take a trip back to the 1920s for a prohibition-era rooftop bar at **Devils River** Whiskey Distillery. The speakeasy vibe is strong in San Antonio. Check out the libations and aperitifs at Cellar Mixology, or make a reservation and head north of Downton to RD Hidden Door Speakeasy, where the cocktails are works of art. In the



Southtown neighborhood, don't miss Bar 1919, a stylish spot serving classic cocktails and charcuterie. Sip on history at **Maverick Whiskey** where history seeps from the barrels in the vault of this restored historic bank building that dates back from 1917. With delicious craft spirits distilled on-site, be sure to take a Tour & Tasting, and learn about the legend of Maverick Whiskey.

The Green Lantern is home to some of the city's best mixologists. Just look for the green light below the patio and enter the single large door. Be your own bartender and craft your own wine at **Re:Rooted 210 Urban Winery**. Interested in what lies beyond? Visit the city's most haunted bars and hotels while you pour some out for the dearly departed on a **Nightly Spirits' Ghost Tour & Pub Crawl**.

If you're looking for dueling pianos and a fun-filled night, get yourself to **Howl at the Moon**. And if a turntable is more your style, go right downstairs to **Merkaba**, a cocktail lounge and nightclub that has DJs spinning when they are not hosting a live band. Trot the culinary globe at Carmens de



la Calle with an always rotating global menu and a dance card featuring everything from Flamenco to Jazz. If honky-tonk is what you are after, amble on over to Cowboys Dancehall, where all the cowboys and cowgirls go. Dance to live country music, ride a mechanical bull, and watch real professional bull riders at the indoor rodeo arena. Cowboys and cowgirls will also enjoy El Honky Tonk, a good old country bar. Dance off all the tasty Texas cuisine you have enjoyed at Jazz, TX with the beats of a live band led by local bandleader Doc Watkins. For a sleek cocktail and some time on the dance floor, slip into the stunning 1902 Nightclub, housed in the former Sunset Station train depot on the city's east side. Late night dancers dance to the beat at Heat, part of The Strip SA, a vibrant nightlife zone of LGBTQ-friendly bars, restaurants and dance clubs. Take your pick of three thumping floors of fun at Bonham Exchange. This downtown hotspot offers a variety of musical genres in an inclusive atmosphere. For a tiki experience try Hugman's Oasis. Or feel the fun of New Orleans at Fat Tuesday.

For a chil vibe, pull up a seat at Sparky's, an old English style pub where you can enjoy a cold draft beer or cocktail in a friendly relaxing atmosphere, or Knockout, a pizza-slinging sports bar with flat screens and a game room. Beyond a rainbow crosswalk, Heat Nightclub lives up to its name with two dance floors, nightly drag and drink specials.

Over at The Bonham Exchange awaits with three levels of exciting entertainment. This 20,000-squarefoot spot was reborn in 1981 as the lively, eclectic queer dance haven thatstands today. For bootscootin', two-step over to SA Country Saloon, which regularly features dance lessons, whiskey happy hours and drag shows, or to the Clib Silver, a country-themed joint with 3 dance floors and karaoke nights await. Cocktail connoisseurs can awaken their taste buds at The Modernist, a cozy, speakeasy-style bar in a converted house. Or stop at swanky rooftop bar **Paramour at the Phipps**, where you'll find even the rarest of cocktailfavorites to enjoy while taking in awesome views of the San Antonio skyline and the swankiest of décor.

Hopscotch San Antonio

An immersive visual and experiential gallery with artistic exhibits around every corner, Hopscotch offers plenty of photo opportunities and an onsite bar with refreshing beverages.

Hot Wells of Bexar County

Stroll the lovely grounds and take in views of the remains of the historic Hot Wells Hotel and bath house in this new city park, where people once enjoyed the therapeutic powers of hot sulfuric waters that flowed from the well during the 19th and 20th centuries.

La Veladora of Our Lady of Guadalupe

Said to be the largest mosaic prayer candle (or *veladora*) in the world, this sculpture by the late San Antonio artist Jesse Treviño is a not-to-miss as it overlooks Guadalupe Street and San Antonio.

Up on the Roof

Enjoy some Texas hospitality and drinks with views over the skyline and San Antonio River. Check out The Moon's Daughters with its 360-degree views or the Fairmount Rooftop Oyster Bar, overlooking Hemisfair Park. Other rooftop venues not to miss include Paramour, Sanchos Cantina & Cocina, Bar America, TopGolf San Antonio, Chicken N Pickle and 1Watson rooftop bar. Order some 'cue with a view at Smoke Texas BBQ + Skybar or see the Alamo City from 750 feet at the revolving Chart House at Tower of the Americas, offering breathtaking panoramas.

San Pedro Culture Creek

Art, nature and culture combine to create the beautiful inner-city oasis that is San Pedro Culture Creek Park. Considered the birthplace of the city, San Pedro Creek is where indigenous peoples and

settlers founded what is San Antonio today. Colorful artworks line the pathways while ornamental and shade trees, as well as grasses and aquatic plants enrich a visitor's experience.

Historic Market Square

The plaza at *Mercado*, or Historic Market Square, can barely contain the lively cultural activity of its restaurants, shops, produce stands and street-performances. Bonus points if you can fit *papel picado*, a mariachi and a margarita all in one frame!

Dia De Muertos Museum

Día de Muertos ("Day of the Dead") is a Mexican tradition that goes deep into Mexico's soul and history, and this museum showcases the country, its art and people with a collection of thousands of art pieces related to the holiday. A sensory experience, the museum captures the vibrancy of the celebration with lights, music, video and live performances. Located above the Fiesta Store near North Start Mall.

San Antonio | The Saga

Take a visual journey through the history of San Antonio with a world-class video art installation, San Antonio | The Saga. Created by world-renowned French artist Xavier de Richemont, San Antonio | The Saga is projected on the façade of the San Fernando Cathedral, the oldest operating sanctuary in North America, in the heart of downtown.

Holiday Lights

San Antonio lights up at the holidays, with dazzling festival holiday lights decorating iconic sites including The Alamo, the San Antonio Zoo and the River Walk, where the annual Ford Holiday River Parade takes the lights to the water. Experience the city's spectacular display of more than 100,000 lights draped over the bald cypress trees that tower above the River Walk. SeaWorld, Six Flags and Morgan's Wonderland also transform into winter wonderlands complete with holiday shows.



LOCAL BREWERIES

Imbibe like a local at San Antonio's growing selection of brewpubs and beer halls. Take advantage of the city's lovely weather with a visit to these outdoor spaces, and enjoy food trucks, live music and great times.

Alamo Beer Company

Located on the city's Eastside near the Hays St. Bridge, enjoy a brisket grilled cheese and sip on an Original Golden as you watch the San Antonio Spurs play at this local favorite. Open daily.

Blue Star Brewing Company

Enjoy a fresh organic beer after biking or strolling through the many historical sites along the San Antonio River at this brew pub located at the head of the Mission Reach trail.

Freetail Brewing Co.

One of the first breweries in the city, the name comes from the Mexican Free-tailed bats that live just north of the city. Try the Freetail taproom downtown or the brewpub on the north side.

Künstler Brewing

Handcrafting German-style beer, this spot combines its pride for all things Texas with Old World Bavarian tradition—that goes for the beer as well as the menu.

Mad Pecker Brewing

Born out of a homebrewing operation in the owners' garage, today this northwest San Antonio brewpub serves up handcrafted beer alongside tasty pub food.

Roadmap Brewing Co.

At Roadmap Brewing Co., a family-run, dog-friendly brewery, all roads lead to beer. Try Late Night Polka Party, the 2022 World Beer Cup Bronze Medal Winner.

Southerleigh Brewing Co.

This brewpub brings brewing back to the historic Pearl Brewery with some 15 beers on tap and a curated, seasonal menu highlighting fresh seafood by San Antonio's Chef Jeff Balfour. (Also try Southerleigh Haute South at the Rim and a new Southerleigh Brewing Co. location coming later in 2023.)

Weathered Souls Brewing

Relying on word-of-mouth, this independent brewer buys local grain to brew beer you could only get in San Antonio. Enjoy sips and bites in the taproom or on the patio. Be sure to try the famous Black is Beautiful stout.

LOCAL DISTILLERIES

The timeless spirit of San Antonio is echoed by the many spirits that are distilled here. The wide variety of liquors and wines made in San Antonio allow you to drink local with every cocktail.

VODKA Artisan Distillery + Craft Bar

Home of Spike, the world's only cactus-based vodka, this distillery offers original drinks, an outdoor patio and a cozy, intimate interior. Try the new artisan beer.

VODKA & WHISKEY Rebecca Creek Distillery

One of the largest spirits producers in the region, Rebecca Creek uses a blend of old and new technology to produce fine Texas vodka and whiskey.

whisker Maverick Whiskey

Named after Samuel Augustus Maverick, signer of the Texas Declaration of Independence, become a Texas Maverick yourself here and sample spirits distilled onsite.

Devils River Distillery

Thrill seekers, night owls and spirits enthusiasts need not look any further than Devils River Distillery in the heart of downtown San Antonio. Enjoy a tasting, tour and more!

For a high-end open-air shopping experience, visit **The Shops at La Cantera**, which overlook **Six Flags Fiesta Texas**. Nearby, the RIM offers boutique shopping, an IMAX theatre, a Bass Pro Shop and delicious dining. Situated in the artsy **Southtown** neighborhood, Blue Star Arts Complex is home to galleries, as well as arty specialty shops and bars.

Home of the largest cowboy boot sculpture, **North Star Mall** is an internationally acclaimed shopping destination that offers 200 specialty stores and your favorite eateries just 10 minutes from downtown.

Look for the iconic smokestacks at The Alamo Quarry Market, a former cement factory turned into a stylish lifestyle center just minutes from downtown. Make sure to stop at storied bootmaker Lucchese, just one of the many cool shops here. Have kids? Join the free factory tour at **San Antonio** **Shoemakers (SAS)**, selling comfortable San Antonio made shoes since 1976.

Down on the River Walk, cool your heels as you hop on a Go RIO San Antonio River Cruise barge for a 35-minute tour of this part of the San Antonio River. Back on land, grab some appetizers and drinks at Paesanos Riverwalk, the Esquire Tavern, or Mad Dogs British Pub, or fuel up at County Line BBQ. Keep the fun going with drinks served lane-side while you bowl, play laser-tag and more at **PINSTACK**, or grab a nightcap while taking in the unbeatable rooftop view at **Paramour**.

Meet the gang at Hopscotch and immerse yourselves in experiential artworks. Chill out with an afternoon of pickleball, shuffleboard, lawn games, drinks and dinner at Chicken N Pickle up north, then head back downtown for a night of bar hopping on The Strip. Make new friends and enjoy the dancing and drag shows at Heat.









DAY TRIPPIN'

Located deep in the heart of Texas, San Antonio provides a convenient place to set out from for day trips. Here are a few small towns worth exploring.

Fredericksburg

Wine enthusiasts, antiques lovers and foodies can't visit San Antonio without a day trip to the picturesque town of Fredericksburg nearby. This is one of the most popular spots in the famed Texas Hill Country, especially popular when lively street festivals and fairs take over the charming and historic Main Street. Pack a picnic and head to nearby Enchanted Rock State Natural Area, featuring a massive, hikeable granite dome rising among the rolling Texas hills. Or stop in at one of the more than 50 wineries and tasting rooms along the scenic Wine Trail, and sip and sample the local fruits.

San Marcos

Or visit the town's colorful historic district and enjoy a meal at one of several unique restaurants. Spend a day on the San Marcos River, where you can tour in a glass-bottom boat or paddle, snorkel and water ski...or just float.



Bandera



Don't Miss the Eclipses

The Alamo City will see two eclipse events—an annular (or "ring") eclipse on **October 14, 2023** (beginning at 10:23 a.m.) and a total solar eclipse on **April 8, 2024** (beginning at 12:14 p.m.).

During the annular eclipse, the Moon will pass directly between the Earth and the Sun, revealing a thin "ring of fire." Six months later, the "once-in-a-lifetime-event" will be a total solar eclipse, when the Moon will pass directly between the Earth and the Sun, darkening the sky as if it were nighttime for up to four minutes and 24 seconds.

The Northwest side of San Antonio is the best place to view these natural phenomena. Wherever you experience the eclipses, you'll need special eye protection, and travel plans should be made in advance to get to the best viewing areas. Easily accessible interstates and highways make getting to all the Alamo City sights a breeze. Staying downtown? Did you know that downtown San Antonio is walkable?

VIA BUS ROUTES

Visitors and locals alike use **VIA Metropolitan Transit** to get around the heart of San Antonio. VIA offers riders convenient fare options. Purchase passes, tickets and Park & Ride Service fare with the VIA goMobile+ App or at any VIA Customer Service Center. Ride all day for one low price using the VIA Day Pass.

SHUTTLES

You just landed at San Antonio International Airport, now what? SuperShuttle offers ground transportation services at San Antonio International Airport and in the surrounding areas. Make a reservation to be transported between San Antonio's major business and entertainment districts and the airport. Look for ticket counters located in baggage claim areas of Terminals A and B. (Several airport-area hotels also offer courtesy van pick-up.)

RENTAL CARS

If you are looking to be your own tour guide, you will be happy to know that all major rental car companies operate at San Antonio International Airport. Car rental counters are located in the lobby of the new Consolidated Car Rental Facility, accessible by elevator or escalator on the Mezzanine Level in Terminal B and across the Sky Bridge.

TAXIS

Catch a cab at the San Antonio International airport located at the outer commercial curbside at Terminal A. (Look for Airport Ground Transportation employees, wearing red shirts, for assistance.). To order a taxi for additional expeditions throughout your stay, you can call or make online reservations. If you have a smartphone, catching a ride is easy with the zTrip app.

RIDE SHARING

Via Link is the city's on-demand ride service, operated by VIA Metropolitan Transit. Or use alternative transportation companies Lyft, Uber and Wingz. Request your ride via each respective company's smartphone app.

PARKING

Pay stations in San Antonio are automated kiosks that accept credit and debit cards, and provide receipts. Instructions are offered in both English and Spanish assist users. Download the SAPark App for easier payment and other options.

GO RIO RIVER SHUTTLE

GO RIO River Shuttle service runs daily. The Shuttle runs along the River Walk from Downtown to Museum Reach. Just look for the GO RIO Shuttle signs. GO RIO ecofriendly electric river boats also offers narrated San Antonio River Walk tours, which leave every 15 minutes and also run daily.

BIKES & SCOOTERS

Enjoy San Antonio's great weather on a pedal-assist San Antonio BCycle. Bikes are available to rent at many spots around town. Choose a day pass that allows for unlimited one-hour trips or a monthly pass if you are here for a few days. Renting electric scooters for riders 16 and older is also an option. Most scooters can be unlocked with a smartphone app and vary in cost to ride.
